It's really refreshing to be getting back to business as usual and have a range of different topics both local and national to report back on.

Loads more happening with our East Mids devolution deal this week! I wrote about the environmental benefits of the deal and how we will be able to develop our own Energy Plan, creating a cleaner, greener future for the region. I also spoke to local businesses on Friday where there's a lot of excitement about the deal's potential to grow business across the region.

I also wrote to Ministers this week about Britain's 'hidden' sports facilities and shared the shocking statistic that 45% of these facilities nationally are locked up every evening and weekend, unavailable for community use.

Speaking in Parliament this week, I asked the Home Secretary Suella Braverman about small boat crossings and the impact this has on local councils, especially when it comes to the vast majority of asylum applications which come from young single men, many who claim to be under 18.

In more positive news, HUGE congratulations to Mansfield theatre Unanima who received a share of £2.5m Arts Council funding, announced Friday!


Last, but certainly not least... I had the opportunity to visit some local businesses last weekend, along with a new local cafe opening in Mansfield this week, a couple of stories about this below.

Poppy Appeal

I'm proud to be supporting Royal British Legion for this year's Poppy Appeal and I know that my constituents across Mansfield and Warsop will also be doing the same!

"Young men are arriving in the UK and later claiming to be unaccompanied children. At that point the local authority has to treat them as 'looked after children'. We then have to look after them until they are 25 years old. The average cost of a looked after child is over £100,000 a year.

I think my constituents will be horrified to learn that their **council tax** is being spent on that when it's intended for public services.

It will be impossible for the public to trust that our **immigration** policies are properly **robust** and **fair** for as long as people can arrive here illegally, from a safe country, and be able to stay here at the **expense** of UK tax payers." Ben Bradley MP serving Mansfeld and Warsop

Small boat crossings & local authorities

I spoke about the situation with small boats in the chamber this

week.

I welcome the Home Secretary's tough stance on this because ending illegal immigration from safe countries is a fundamental issue of fairness. My constituents need to know that the system is working for them, and not prioritising those who have arrived here illegally, having paid people traffickers to get them here from safe countries like Albania, or France.

I asked her additionally to look at some of our domestic rules here in the UK, where young single males - who make up the majority of cases - claiming to be under 18 can end up being 'looked after children' with taxpayers responsible for their welfare until they're 25, at great cost. That's easily rectified if Government want to save money, and allow Councils to focus on public services instead.

Unlocking 'hidden' sports facilities


I've written to Ministers this week to once again raise the issue of Britain's 'hidden' sports facilities, with around 45% of facilities in our schools locked up every evening and weekend, not available for community use.

It's a travesty that we have so many - tens of thousands - of sites with good facilities that are left unused, when we have made health inequalities and inactivity key priorities for health and levelling up. The most disadvantaged areas have particular problems with access to sports and leisure facilities.

Locally, we've recently seen the Manor Sports Centre close last year as the Academy Trust decided that it couldn't keep it open to the community any more. That's understandable in many ways, as of course the school is going to prioritise the curriculum etc, but it's meant that countless local clubs and groups have been made homeless, and deprived the local area of use of these facilities.

I've been trying to work locally with partners to get it reopened, but so far we've not been able to find a solution.

I'm asking Government to get involved, and to help us reopen facilities like these, so that they're not wasted when communities want to be able to make the most of them!





380 more police officers for Notts

I work closely with Nottinghamshire Police and I know how hard they work every day to keep the streets of Mansfield and Warsop safe.

An additional 380 police on our streets will play a huge role in pursuing criminals, keeping neighbourhoods safe, protecting victims and reassuring the law-abiding majority.

This Conservative Government is delivering on its promises to the British people – showing it is only the Conservatives that can be trusted to keep Britain's streets safe.

This week was the opening of Roots coffee lounge at Pleasley Landmark which is run by Mansfield charity, REAL Foundation Trust.


The charity supports young people with additional needs and disabilities into finding meaningful employment through mentoring and out of hours opportunities.

Support local businesses


I was out and about in the constituency last weekend delivering my newsletter to residents and visiting local businesses.


Chesterfield Road highways works




More diversity of experience in teaching

This week I spoke in Parliament about the recruitment and retention of teachers. Before politics, teaching is what I always wanted to do, and I've always felt that we should open up teaching to a wider range of people, and have more diversity - not of physical characteristics, but of background and experience. I think we should do more to support people from business and industry to get in to teaching, do more to support different routes like Apprenticeships for Teaching Assistants to progress and become Teachers, support pathways from Early Years education in to Primary Schools so that people with the background and experience with children can progress in to teaching without the financial barriers of having to go and get a degree or PGCE...

More options and flexibility for people who want to teach, and for schools to bring in good people with a wide range of backgrounds and experience, can only be a good thing.

I also spoke about the importance of male role models in teaching, with almost a third of East Midlands schools having no male teachers at all. Those role models are so important, and we absolutely must do more to ensure that we have more positive male role models in our schools too.

Pleased to confirm that as a share of 15,300 extra police officers nationally, Nottinghamshire has recruited 380 with more to come as the government plans to train a further 5,000.
