


Armed Forces Day in Mansfield!

Changes to Mansfield constituency boundary

This week the Boundary Commission published their final decision about boundaries for the next General Election in Mansfield (likely to

be next Autumn, best guess!)

This is the final decision, following several rounds of consultation, and cannot now be changed. I'm not very happy about it, to be honest, and I will explain why.

It's important to recognise - despite my frustration - that this ONLY affects the Parliamentary boundary. It does not change which Council you are under. If you are under Mansfield District Council now, that does not change. There are no changes to who delivers any of your local services. Only your Parliamentary constituency changes. It also does not change immediately. I will be your MP until the next General election, and the boundaries will change at that point.

I have to be honest and say I'm not happy, and I don't agree with the outcome. I'm frustrated that the Commission only showed us this particular version at the 'final draft' stage, with previous versions having been very different. As a result I don't feel we've had a full chance to argue the case. The postal strike at the time of the consultation also meant that some residents in affected areas didn't receive notification of the consultation until after the deadline. I did ask the Commission to offer flexibility, but they wouldn't do that.

I argued, as did a number of residents, that these areas - Pleasley, Bull Farm and part of Berry Hill - do not have any direct links to Ashfield conurbations, and whilst some areas of Mansfield do connect directly in to Sutton, for example, and you can walk between the two without ever leaving the urban area, these parts they've chosen to remove have no obvious links to Ashfield.

They've not taken my comments in to account, and instead have listened to Labour's comments. To be honest I think the motives for Labour's comments were more about what votes they'd get than the right thing for the community. All this is available on the boundary commission website so you can come to your own conclusion on that if you're interested.

Anyway, as I said, I'm disappointed. This is the final decision though, and cannot now be changed. Constituencies are being balanced up in terms of numbers, and Mansfield had to shrink in order to achieve this, so I am sad to be losing some parts of the community I currently represent, even though I know they will be well served by the Ashfield MP.

Targeted lung health screenings in coalfield communities

From 2017 to 2019 Sherwood MP Mark Spencer and I lobbied the Government for targeted lung health screenings in our coalfield communities, to help identify and get early treatment for people in our area, which has a very high prevalence of lung conditions due to both high smoking rates and our coalfield history.

This lobbying resulted in a Mansfield and Ashfield pilot programme, which has since screened thousands of 'at risk' local people and helped to identify cancers early, improving the outcomes for those people and saving lives.

The programme is now being rolled out nationally, as its been shown to be beneficial both in terms of those health outcomes and also in preventing more expensive treatments later on. A real success story and now a billion pound investment in preventative care.

Making progress on potholes and road repairs

Over the winter we've talked a lot about roads, and about delivering better quality repairs, first time around, rather than filling holes. I get as frustrated as anybody about all of this, and my response has always been that this - better quality, right first time - is exactly where Via and Notts Highways are trying to get to.

Now that the pressure of chasing after weather damage has subsided, you'll begin to see more of this kind of work on our roads; properly cut and sealed, high quality patch repairs as the first options wherever its possible.

There will still be occasions where filling a hole is a legal obligation, but we're giving front line teams more flexibility to do what is best rather than what is quickest.

In the coming weeks we'll also be launching a new website where you can track all of the work, including before and after images, to see what's happening.

One of my big national campaigns has been to open up more sports facilities, particularly where they already exist but are not open to the public, like in schools. We've managed to secure over £10m nationally to help to do that, and get school facilities open, and now I need to try and ensure that some of that comes our way (particularly for Manor Sports Centre just up the road from here).

Bid for life-saving Defibrillators

Community Organisations Invited to Bid for Life-Saving Defibrillators.

• We are inviting community organisations to bid for funding for an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for their area.

• £1 million fund to increase the number of AEDs in public places where they are most needed.

• Funding will provide an estimated 1000 new defibrillators in community spaces across England.

Organisations across England are being invited to bid for a share of £1 million of government funding to buy life-saving defibrillators for community spaces.

An estimated 1,000 new defibrillators will be provided by the fund, with the potential for this to double as successful applicants will be asked to match the funding they receive partially or fully.

As part of the grant award, applicants will be asked to demonstrate that defibrillators will be placed in areas where they are most needed, such as places with high footfall, vulnerable people, rural areas, or due to the nature of activity at the site.

Examples could include town halls, community centres, local shops, post offices and local parks, to ensure that defibrillators are evenly spread throughout communities and easily accessible if someone is experiencing an unexpected cardiac arrest.

Organisations who submit an expression of interest will be notified once grant applications open to the Department of Health and Social Care's £1m Community AED Fund.

The funding is part of our drive to equip the health system with the right technology to ease pressures, reduce backlogs and cut waiting lists, and to improve public access to care when they need it.
