75 years of the NHS and a long-term plan for its future

That is why we are supporting our NHS with record levels of investment and record numbers of doctors and nurses. Investment must be supported by reform, which is why last week we set out our 15-year NHS workforce plan, backed by £2.4 billion, modernising the workforce and setting out the largest expansion in training and recruitment in the NHS' history.

We are confident that with our plans for recovery and reform and an embrace of technology and innovation, it will be fit to deliver the best care to patients for another 75 years, as we deliver on the Prime Minister's pledge to cut waiting lists.

A pleasure to speak to the Institute for Government and University of Nottingham conference on devolution, here in Nottinghamshire. We shared some aspirations for our region, some of the challenges and the journey, and also a take on some of the national policy around empowering local communities and leaders to deliver more.



Continuing to reduce the County Council's office footprint

The County Council is moving it's Civic 'Head Office' from West Bridgford to Hucknall, in the middle of the County. The move will save millions of pounds for local taxpayers, ensuring that we are spending money on delivering services for people rather than on heating empty old buildings. It's part of a bigger plan that has seen us reduce our office footprint from 17 buildings down to nine.

As it stands, though County Hall is a lovely, historic building, it costs £1.7m a year to run and is only 30% occupied. To maintain it for the next 15 years will cost over £50m of taxpayer's money. It's also nowhere near the levels of energy efficiency etc that residents would

expect. That just isn't viable, and we cannot legitimately prioritise maintaining a building over delivering vital services, and so we will be asking Councillors next week to agree to vacate the building.

Instead we'll be locating the democratic decision making part of the Council in Hucknall, with an £18m+ investment in the local area, new jobs, new bus connections and a boost to the local economy there. Public services will also be located there, improving access to local residents. The plan will also mean that decision making will be equally accessible to more people, being based in the centre of our county rather than at the southern border.

This move will save over a million pounds a year in running costs, be far better for emissions, energy efficiency and the environment, and obviously also avoid that huge £50m bill to maintain County Hall. When you consider these figures, it's the only logical decision to make the best use of taxpayer's money.

Obviously we'll protect the heritage of County Hall and work with residents there to decide what to do with it next. Whatever it is will be in-keeping with the nature of the building and protect it's features etc. We'll also continue to have a staff base in West Bridgford of course, at Trent Bridge House just over the road. The County Hall site has the potential to be a wonderful asset to the local area in the future with a positive and attractive new use.
