### £500 million of extra funding for Councils!

It's always rewarding when you work hard to achieve something, and you get results. In recent months I've lead a campaign alongside colleagues from Councils and in Parliament to ensure that we support local Councils to deliver vital services to vulnerable people.

Where budgets are squeezed, children's services and adult social care are coming under pressure, and Councils have a legal duty to provide them, but not enough money to do it. Our campaign has lead to Government amending the recent Local Government settlement and increasing funding for these services. A big, big win.

Some Councils are in a mess through their own mistakes, and those that have gone bust like Nottingham or Birmingham have shown high profile waste and bad decisions, but pretty much all Councils -

even well run ones - are under financial pressure as demand and costs rise, just the same as household budgets get squeezed.

That's why this victory is so important, because ultimately that money - whilst not fixing the more fundamental issue of long term sustainability - will protect communities all around the country and be the difference between a library or a children's centre shutting, or not in those areas. That's a big thing!

Fortunately, Nottinghamshire County Council is a well run and financially challenging stable authority, but we're still under huge pressure from the rising demand and cost of care services, for both children and adults. This money - whilst not ultimately a solution to that - will help us to navigate those pressures and reduce the impact on communities and taxpayers, which can only be good news.

#### **Keir Starmer's Culture Wars Obsession?**

I was on GB News with Martin Daubney responding to Keir Starmer's nonsense about Conservatives stoking "culture wars".

In Starmer's big speech this week, he reckons he'll change our society so everyone is nice to each other, and all will be well. That is of course as long as you don't question anything, because only one set of opinions is allowed. If you disagree then you're guilty of stoking culture wars, and your opinion doesn't count.

That's the world according to the Labour Leader. The man who would be Prime Minister.

As ever, Starmer delivers another speech full of meaningless waffle, and absolutely no firm plans for anything at all.

The Conservative Group alternative budget proposals 2025/26
Proposed by Councillor Camilleri
Seconded by Councillor Moxon

wish to move an amendment to the Elected Mayor's proposed Budget in respect of the General Fund as follows:

- Reducing the number of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny committees from three to one resulting in a core budget saving of £13,840 in each financial year, totalling £41,520 across the Medium Term Financial Plan.
- 2. Keep Mansfield Woodhouse toilet open at a cost of £12,603 each year.
- No increase in members' allowances across the full term of the Medium Term Financial Plan. This will result in additional savings of £43,163 in 2025/26 and £66,377 in 2026/2027 totalling £109,540.
- Continue the 50% reduction in the members' ward allowance across the full term of the Medium Term Financial Plan. This will result in additional savings of £9,000 in 2025/26 and £9,000 in 2026/2027 totalling £18,000.
- Maintain grants to external bodies in 2025/26 and 2026/27 at the 2024/25 level to enable the Council to continue to support these valuable organisations.

The impact of these changes on the 2025/26 budget and the Medium Term Financial Plan is set out in the following appendix.

#### Labour-led MDC rejects budget proposal that would have kept public toilets open and community groups funded

This week MDC Labour rejected the Mansfield Conservatives Budget proposal.

Conservatives want to cancel Labour's decision to close public toilets and cut grant funding to community groups, and instead make the savings from Councillor Allowances and by having fewer Committees.

Labour said no.
